Special weekend at the Kinema

Their film documented their search for Van Duren and his lost career and received standing ovations in the United States. The Kinema was its Australian premiere.

What a wonderful weekend at the Kinema at the start of April with two special events as well as the normal screenings.

First, one song by Van Duren and then a lost album inspired muso friends Dalmeny local Greg Carey and Wade Jackson to go to the United States in search of Van Duren's story. His career in the late 1970s as a musician and songwriter promised much but quickly faded into obscurity.

They documented their search in a film and along the way managed to recover and restore Van Duren's rights to his own music. An extraordinary journey that screened to sellout audiences in the USA. Its Australian premiere was in the Kinema on Saturday 6 April.

Narooma local Bruce Frost suggested the Narooma should be on the tour of Van Duren and the band at a later date. Not possible unfortunately, they said. (over page)
