The SOA intends running various workshops and exhibitions in other locations around the area until the new building is up and running in late 2023. All suggestions and inquiries are most welcome. The first workshop off-site will be in Bodalla next month.

A fascinating **Eco-printing and Dyeing Workshop** by **Sue Barford** will be held in Bodalla Hall on Saturday 4 June 12.30-3.30pm. Details on page 4. This should be inspiring as well as very informative. Sue will provide an introduction to the process of botanical eco-printing and dyeing techniques on wool from flowers, leaves and plants. At the end of the workshop you will take home a pure merino wool wrap that you have personally printed/dyed. The cost is \$150. 


